<b>Primary Route of Exposure:</b>	Skin, Eye Contact, Inhalation and Ingestion
<b>Specific Organ Toxicity - Single Exposure</b>	Target organs include ears, skin, respiratory system, and gastrointestinal tract.
<b>Specific Organ Toxicity – Repeated Exposure</b>	Causes damage to eyes, skin, respiratory system, and gastrointestinal tract through prolonged or repeated exposure.
<b>Acute Short-Term Exposure Effects</b>	May cause eye irritation, skin irritation, respiratory tract irritation, and gastrointestinal tract irritation. Inhalation of high concentrations of dry clay dust may cause mechanical irritation and discomfort. Long term exposure may cause chronic effects.

Repeated or prolonged exposure of respirable crystalline silica dust may cause lung damage in the form of silicosis. Acute silicosis can be fatal.
